The Most Holy Trinity Year C

12 June 2022

Jesus is speaking to his disciples at the Last Supper. He is about to die and still has much to say to them, but they cannot take it in now. He trusts that with the coming of the Holy Spirit, the disciples will remain in intimate relationship with himself and his Father. We, too, participate in the life of the Trinity in the depths of our hearts.

My Brothers and Sisters,

This weekend we commemorated the Holy Trinity. This 'feast' is odd in that it, in a sense, is the commemoration of us understanding something about God or receiving a revelation about Him and not about our relationship with Him. That being said the understanding of the nature of God - as a trinity and thus a community of persons (using 'person' in the philosophical sense). From this understanding, the divine nature of God as love becomes more understandable.

The divine nature of God is often summarized as 'love' (1 John 4:8;16) and for St John and St Paul (1 Cor 13:4 -7), understanding what love IS, becomes a requirement for understanding God whom we worship. This is due to the fact that love does not exist in isolation from other people or 'objects of love'. Therefore, God is love because he loves (the Father loves the Son). Additionally. God is love because he is loved (the Son is loved by the Father) and being loved he returns the love (the Son loves that father). Lastly, this exchange of love is so powerful and 'real' that it forms by its nature another person (the Holy Spirit which proceeds from the Father and the Son). Therefore, with a focus on this biblical attribute of God's nature - 'Love' - we can see how it is that God exists as a trinity, united by love while being unique in the personhood of Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

In our worship of God, we are drawn closer to this exchange of love and are affected by it. The Holy Spirit which we understand to be the love that proceeds from the Father to the Son is the spirit of God within us. It is eternal, divine love that marks us as Christians and with that there should be nothing we cannot face.


