Dear Brother and Sisters.

Earlier this week I was able to go into St Mary's Cathedral in the city to see the lights of Christmas. This year's show is even more explicitly religious than in previous years. The incredible, moving images, projected onto the cathedral's façade, chart the story of salvation from the Garden of Eden to the Annunciation, to the birth of Jesus in Bethlehem. The show is a stunning, visual catechesis that reminds Sydney of the true reason this is a season of joy.

This year, the cathedral doors have also been left open during the evening so that the thousands of people gathering to see the lights can come inside and visit Our Lord's earthly dwelling. People of all faiths and none are passing through St Mary's where everything around them tells of the Saviour's birth. I pray many people will look for God as a result.

As we celebrate the birth of Christ this year, we can't let this glorious reality remain distant. There is a real reason we say "Christ is born" and not "Christ was born." When we attend Christmas Mass, St Patrick's church will cease to be a piece of real estate in Sutherland but it will become the stable at Bethlehem and you and I will find ourselves at the moment of Jesus' birth. Our joy is the same joy as the angels, shepherds and wise men. Our wonder and contemplation is like Our Lady's and St Joseph's and the graces received by us are the same given to those men and women who saw Jesus with their own eyes. This Christmas we see again that love itself has entered the world, to save us, give us hope and open the way to Heaven. Our joy needs to be real because the consequences of Jesus' birth are real!


