

# Bible Study Currently Chapter 12 Next meeting 15 June due to Confirmation on 8

Next meeting 15 June due to Confirmation on 8th.

My word will not return to me unfulfilled, it will accomplish my purpose. (Is 55:11) Come join us as we discuss **The Acts of the Apostles**, currently Chapter 12 6 pm Thursday evening for an hour at the Presbytery.

In this chapter of Lumen Gentium we are looking at the Church with an Eschatological lens. The Communion of the Saints idea includes those living on earth, those being purified, and those in heaven. The Church is on a Pilgrim journey following the example of those who have gone before us.

We first pray for the forgiveness of their sins and then ask for their guidance and intercession. Devotion to saints has largely sprung from the people rather than doctrinal direction. Church leaders are careful to assure devotions always fit within the fuller light of faith and directs our gaze to the triune God.

The lives of the saints demonstrates people of all times and places struggling on this pilgrim journey and in that, we see our own struggles as a path to heaven. In this view of life and salvation, we are united in a communion of charity, each supporting the other. Throughout the year our liturgy remembers saints on their assigned days.

Para 51 points out that such veneration goes back as far as the council of Nicaca 325 AD, and has been endorsed by many Councils since. We need to guard against excesses which simply multiply external actions and be sure our focus is alway on the Father, Son and Holy Spirit. We seek to walk in their example to our final reward.
