## Third Sunday of Easter

In today's Gospel, we hear about Jesus appearing to his disciples following his Resurrection. The reading, taken from the Gospel of Luke, follows immediately after the report of Jesus' appearance to his disciples on the road to Emmaus.

In the reports of Jesus' post-resurrection appearances, he consistently greets his disciples with the words, "Peace be with you," acknowledging their fears and offering them peace and the gift of forgiveness.

Even though they hear Jesus' greeting of peace, the disciples are surprised and fearful. They don't know what to make of the figure before them and mistake Jesus for a ghost. The disciples eventually come to realise that Jesus, with his resurrected body bearing the marks of crucifixion, is real and brings them joy and peace.

Eating with his disciples, Jesus continues the tradition of shared meals, emphasising the importance of these gatherings, most importantly, recalling the Last Supper. Luke's depiction of the Last Supper and the post-resurrection meals that Jesus shared reveal the profound importance of the Eucharist. By dining with his disciples, Jesus illuminates the scriptural prophecies about himself. In the same way, our celebration of the Mass is an encounter with Jesus, through the Word and the Sacrament of the Eucharist. Just as Jesus entrusted his disciples to bear witness to the fulfilment of scripture, our participation in the Eucharist similarly empowers us to serve. Like the disciples, we are commissioned to announce the good news of Jesus' forgiveness of sins. Ann Woodhouse,
